ENTRIES AND FEES

Working Certificate (WC): \$ 50.00 per dog **Entry Fees:**

> Working Certificate Intermediate (WCI): \$ 55.00 per dog Working Certificate Excellent (WCX): \$ 60.00 per dog

Puppies: All dogs must be at least 6 months of age on the day of the test.

Entries: Note that dogs are allowed to enter only one level.

> As per CKC rules, dogs should ascend through Working Certificate levels sequentially – in other words pass the WC before running the

WCI, and pass the WCI before running the WCX.

Online entry via <u>www.dogshow.ca</u>, from 8:00am on Wednesday June 26th.













Exhibitors must abide by errors made in entering their dogs regardless of how or by whom the errors were made. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry subject to CKC rules. Any NSF cheques will be subject to a **\$30.00** service charge. Entry fee plus service charge for NSF cheques must be paid in cash prior to test.

Bitches in season will not be permitted on test grounds. Entry fees will be refunded when a veterinarian's certificate is presented before the start of the test.

Temporary Competition Numbers: All owners of <u>unregistered</u>, CKC-recognized breeds entering events are required to obtain a Temporary Competition Number (TCN). TCNs are replacing the current system of entering events with dogs as "listed", and allow dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN). A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event. The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered or has an ERN. A TCN cannot be used for Listed Breeds with an MCN (Miscellaneous Competition Number) or dogs that will require a PEN (Performance Event Number) or CCN (Canine Companion Number).

TCNs can be obtained:

- Online through CKC Portal (Note individuals who have not yet used the online Portal will be required to create a Portal account before they can submit a TCN application online), or
- By submitting a completed paper application by mail to CKC or by contacting the Shows and Trials Division, toll free.

RUNNING ORDER AND GAME

Running order will be determined by draw after closing, with sexes mixed. When multiple entries are received with the same handler, dogs will be separated in the running order where possible.

Running orders and test site addresses, plus a digital copy of the catalogue will be emailed or otherwise made available to participants after closing. Printed copies of the catalogue will not be available on site, but running order will be available.

Ducks will be used for the land and water series of the tests.

ROSETTES

Rosettes will be presented to dog/handler teams passing the test.

OTHER INFORMATION

- Handlers running WCX will be required to handle a gun or replica. At all levels the gun/replica shall be treated as a real firearm. Gun safety is paramount, and unsafe gun handling can result in the handler's removal from the test.
- All participants and spectators must wear dark or camouflage clothing (except that handlers are allowed to wear white during the blind portions of the WCX).
- Refunds will be given for bitches in season or dogs determined by a veterinarian to be unfit to compete. A Veterinarian Certificate should be submitted before the start of the test.

- CKC Working Certificate rules state that there shall be no training of dogs on the grounds of a test, except for single training bumpers which are thrown by hand by the handler, either within 24 hours of the commencement of the event, or at any time during the event.
- CKC Working Certificate rules state that electronic collars (either dummy or live) as well as prong or pinch type collars shall not be worn by a dog on the grounds of a Hunt Test at any time during the event with the exception of those collars designed to curb barking which may be worn by a dog while kenneled.
- The marshal is in control of the stake. Do not approach the judges directly. Ask questions during the handler's meeting at the start of each test. Otherwise, direct inquiries through the marshal.
- Handlers are advised that they may be asked to help operate a gun station when they are not running. Please pitch in if asked to facilitate the smooth running of the test.
- No meals, drinks, or snacks will be available on site. Please bring your own.
- Please respect the landowners that have so graciously allowed us on their land by obeying all signage or directions and removing all garbage and debris. Close all gates and park ONLY where advised.

CKC NON-MEMBER PARTICIPATION FEE

Dogs wholly owned by Canadian residents that are not a member of CKC that are eligible to receive Working Certificate titles will have 30 days to either become a CKC member or to pay a non-member participation fee to CKC, otherwise titles will not be awarded. Note that this is not applicable to CKC members or to dogs co-owned with a CKC member.


DIRECTIONS

Headquarters: Union Hall, 1984 Wolfgrove Road (corner of Tatlock Road), Clayton

Directions from Ottawa – 2 options:

- Take March Road / Ottawa Regional Road 49 (exit 155) south through Almonte, which eventually becomes Wolfgrove Road – follow it to Tatlock Rd Or:
 - 2) Take Highway 7 south through Carleton Place then turn right onto Tatlock Road and follow it to Wolfgrove Road.

Test locations will be near Union Hall – details will be provided a couple of days before the test so that you can go straight to the test location on test day.
