* **TEMPORARY COMPETITION NUMBER** (EFFECTIVE MARCH 2, 2020) A Temporary Competition Number (TCN) must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event. The same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog <u>until the dog is permanently registered</u>. Once a dog is permanently registered or has an ERN, the TCN will be replaced with the registration number or ERN. A TCN cannot be used for Listed Breeds (MCN) or dogs that will require a Performance Event Number (PEN) or Canine Companion Number (CCN). There is no fee to obtain a TCN however exhibitors will still be required to pay TCN Fees when entering events using a TCN. TCN Numbers may be obtained online via the CKC website where the number is issued instantly. Exhibitors may also mail in a printed application or contact CKC Shows and Trials by phone for a number. If your dog does not have a registration number or ERN and has already competed in a CKC event and earned points, scores or awards, before applying for a TCN online, exhibitors are encouraged to check their dog's profiles to determine if the CKC has already created a TCN for that dog. There will be a tab called TCN Dogs in the owner's Portal account.

NOTE: Separate entry forms are required for each class entered.

MAILED ENTRIES - CKC official entry forms must be used. Completed entry forms are to be sent only to the Trial Secretary:

All entries must be in the hands of the event secretary by the official closing date and time, with the exception of "day of" entries. All fees must be paid at the time of entry. Please make cheques or money orders payable to: River Valley Obedience & Field Trial Club Inc (or RVO&FTC).

NSF Cheques: Section 6.3.3: "Tendering of a dishonoured cheque or credit card in payment of entry fees shall be considered non-payment of entry fees, and is an offence punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards."

* Please note that a service charge of 10% will be assessed for entries sent online, by fax or any entry using a credit card or Interac for payment. Dogshow.ca Refund Policy – service fees are not refundable for any reason

Canadian Residents, please note: The CKC has implemented an annual "non-member participation fee" for residents of Canada who are not members of the CKC. Check with the CKC for the current fee. The non-member participation fee is paid in any year a title is earned and covers all titles earned and dogs owned by that individual. In order for the title to be awarded, the non-member will have a choice to either become a CKC member or pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will result in the title being withheld and the dog cannot be moved up to the next level. The fee applies only to dogs wholly owned by non-member residents of Canada and is not applicable to CKC members.

Ribbons, Rosettes & Awards

Qualifying (flat) ribbons will be awarded to all dogs with qualifying scores in Novice, Open, Excellent and Masters	Rosettes will be awarded to any dog who completes a title at one of these titles, including all dogs who pass their Instinct Test Please claim a rosette when you pick up your Qualifying ribbon and score sheet.

General Information

- 1. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be familiar with the most recent version of the rules. <u>CKC rules are posted</u> on the CKC website or copies of the Scent Detection Trials Rules & Regulations may be purchased from the CKC. Only certain sections of the rules are highlighted under General Information, so they should not be considered to be complete.
- 2. Pinch/prong collars are not permitted on the trial site (see #11 for trial site)
- 3. BITCHES IN SEASON (BIS) are permitted to compete as long as they wear clean, properly fitted panties. Owners of the dog must inform the club prior to commencement of the Trial. The dog must be moved to the end of the run order for any class they are entered in. Refund of entry will also be made for bitches who come into season after entries close. Request in writing must be submitted to Trial Secretary with certificate from a veterinarian prior to commencement of the Trial.
- 4. Day-of entries are permitted if limited if not reached. Day-of entries must be made at least one hour prior to the start of the trial.
- 5. If you were unable to enter these Trials due to the limit being reached, you will automatically be placed on a waitlist.
- CONTAGIOUS DISEASE Refund of entry (less CKC fee) will be made for dogs that are under a veterinarian's care for contagious disease diagnosed after entries close. Request in writing must be submitted to Trial Secretary along with a letter from a veterinarian on or before the day of the Trial.
- 7. It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Event Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. Please refer to the current rule book for eligibility requirements for each class. It is your responsibility to ensure that your dog is entered in the correct class.
- 8. All exhibitors will be responsible for clean up on the grounds and surrounding areas for their own dogs and/or dogs they are handling.
- 9. One dog per handler per class.
- 10. Exhibitors must abide by any errors made in entering their dogs, regardless of how or who made the errors.
- 11. The precincts of the trials will include the entire Marysville Heritage Centre property.
- 12. Only dogs entered in the trials will be allowed within the precincts of the trials (see above).
- 13. Judging schedules and any other pertinent information will be distributed to exhibitors after entries close.
- 14. All dogs that are foreign born and owned who enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events will require an Event Registration Number (ERN). An ERN must be obtained within 30 days of earning points, awards or scores to avoid cancellation. If factors beyond your control prohibit this or present a problem, please send a written request for a 30-day extension to the CKC. An ERN may be obtained by contacting the CKC.
- 15. The Club and the Trial Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, nor assume any liability, in the event of accident or other misfortune to dogs, exhibitors or patrons. Neither the Club nor the Trial Committee will be responsible for dogs or property at the trial site.
- 16. If, because of riot, civil disturbance or other acts beyond the control of the Club, it is impossible to open or complete the Trial, no refund of entries will be made.
