#### Dr. Gail H. Forsythe, Canada

Dr. Forsythe began judging in 1996. She is CKC licensed for all groups and BIS. She has judged all breed shows and specialties in Australia, Canada, China, Hawaii, Italy, Japan, the Philippines, New Zealand, Switzerland, the UK and the USA. In 2006, she received an AKC Outstanding Sportsmanship award.

Dr. Forsythe's passion for purebred dogs began in 1967, with a Samoyed; later in 1970, Golden Retrievers and Boxer. In 1975, she CKC registered "Lionheart" and bred #1 ranked dogs and MBIS winning Chows for 25 years, MBIS Pekingese for 15 years, and since 2007, multiple World Dog Show winning Japanese Chin. "Lionheart" has over 150 Championship

titles in 10 countries. Dr. Forsythe is a practicing lawyer/mediator.



#### Kim Hamel, Canada

I started in dogs in 1988 with a purebred English Springer Spaniel followed shortly after with a Cavalier King Charles Spaniel. This began a journey that has had many twists and turns. Along the way, my learning curve as a breeder and as an exhibitor was steep but enjoyable and very rewarding. I was fortunate to have placed in the Top Obedience totals as per DIC with my ESS and was in the top 5 for conformation with my Cavaliers for a couple of years running. I still own the only Cavalier to have won our Canadian National Speciality on two separate occasions. Recently I added a saucy Norwich Terrier to my household who finished very quickly and now competes in Rally and obedience. I have owned and shown a variety of breeds over the years which have included Springers, Cavaliers, Yorkshire terriers, Chihuahuas, Beagles, Dachshunds, Kerry Blue terriers, Keeshond, Sheltie, German

I started judging in 2005 with approval for Group 1. Was secretary for the Red River Terrier Club in Manitoba and secretary/treasurer of CDJA Manitoba Chapter and current member of CDJA and now chair of VIDJSG. I also served one term as Manitoba Director on the Board of Directors for CKC.

First judgments in the year 2003, He is currently an international judge by FCI, all breeds by AKC (102023). He has judged in many countries of Latin America, USA, and China. He mixes it with his professional and academic activities.

I am a life member of the Canadian Kennel Club and The German Shepherd Dog Club of Manitoba. I am also a member of The German Shepherd Dog Club of Canada, The German Shepherd Dog Club of America and The British Columbia German Shepherd Dog Club.

I have been a licensed judge since 2010. I am a member of The Canadian Dog Judge's Association and the Dog Judge's Association of America. I am now licensed to Judge the Herding and Working Groups. I am also on permit (provision) for half of the Hound Group. I had the privilege of judging class Dogs and Intersex at the German Shepherd Dog Club of Canada's National Specialty Show.

I am retired from breeding and handling dogs. I am the Education Chairperson for the German Shepherd Dog Club of Canada and I look forward to continuing in this sport as a specialty and all-breed judge, and as an educator for my beloved breed.

## GENERAL RULES GOVERNING THESE SHOWS

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be familiar with the rules pertaining to the event in which they are competing. Copies of the Conformation Rule book are available from the CKC, 400 200 Ronson Dr., Etobicoke, ON M9W 5Z9

- 1. The Club reserves the right to remove any person from the show. The Show Superintendent shall have full control of the above shows and trials, which will be governed by CKC rules.
- 2. Any dog excused by the Show Superintendent or the Show Veterinarian for any reason shall not, after being excused, compete in any class for any award for the balance of the show.
- 3. The show committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors, but will not be responsible for, or assume any liability in the event of accident, or other misfortune, to either dogs, exhibitors or patrons.
- 4 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.
- 5. Exhibitors are solely responsible for the conduct or actions of their animals while they are on the show grounds.
- 6. DOGS MUST BE READY FOR JUDGING. The Club will not be responsible for and is not obligated to provide any service for notifying owners or agents of breed or class judging. No ring shall be held up waiting for exhibitors or handlers. Exhibitors & Handlers with more than one dog shall have substitute handlers available so the judging will not be delayed. All start times are **MOUNTAIN DAYLIGHT TIME.**
- 7. The owner of a dog entered in these shows is entirely responsible for any error in entering his/her dog, regardless of how or by whom the entry was made.
- 8. A dog once disqualified for any reason at a championship show held under these rules cannot again be shown at a show held under these rules until the dog has been examined by an official committee appointed by the CKC and the committee finds the dog is free from the condition which prompted the disqualification. Application for reinstatement must be accompanied by a fee of \$50.00 plus GST which shall be forfeited to the CKC if the examining committee is satisfied that the dog should remain disqualified. All awards earned at a dog show in violation of this rule shall be canceled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action.
- 9. Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for their dogs and for their equipment left at the Show Grounds.
- 10. For the benefit of the health of animals and the pleasure of the exhibitors and spectators we insist upon keeping our grounds and buildings as clean as possible. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs. Please exercise your dog BEFORE taking it to the Judging ring. Dogs are to be exercised in the designated areas only, not in the vicinity of the ring areas.
- 11. No entry fee will be refunded if the Show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, and Act of God, public emergency, act of public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club.
- 12. Entry fees will not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee.

## CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB SCHEDULE OF CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

SECTION 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows: (\*Includes the dog awarded Winners.)

Dogs Competing\* 1 2 3 to 5 6 to 9 10 to 12 13 or more Points Allocated\* 0 1 2 3 4 5

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded Winners, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated, directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule set forth above. A dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for championship points. Further section 15.1.12 {C} has been added and states the dog must: "have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed level or group level."

The system provides for additional points if a dog awarded winners also places in the Group as listed hereunder.

A class Dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than five (5) points at a single show. To earn a Canadian Championship, a dog must earn at least ten championship points under at least three different judges; and be individually registered with the Canadian Kennel Club, or have a CKC EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBER (ERN).

Grand Champion (GCh) The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC Conformation Championship. Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Conformation Championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the Conformation Championship. All required points are to be earned at the breed level. To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points which must include one Best of Breed and a minimum of two wins of at least two points each. a) Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title are awarded to the Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed Winner and the number of similar sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded as follows:

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.

The title of Grand Champion shall not be awarded retroactively and all points towards this title must be achieved after the date of January 1, 2013. Points earned toward the Grand Champion title are to be recorded by the owner/handler on the form obtained from the Canadian Kennel Club. Once the owner/handler believes that their exhibit has attained the requirements for the Grand Champion title, the form may be submitted to the Canadian Kennel Club for verification and awarding of the title.

**Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx)** The title of Grand Champion Excellent may only be earned after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship title.

**VETERAN CLASS** - In this optional class for All Breed Shows, dogs must be 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered. The awards for this class are: Best Male Veteran and Best Female Veteran Best Veteran in Breed

Best Veteran in Group Best Veteran in Show A Veteran awarded Best Veteran in Breed is not required to stay to compete for Best Veteran in Group. A Veteran awarded Best Veteran in Group is not required to stay to compete for Best Veteran in Show.


