Entries will not be accepted unless accompanied by payment; forms and fees must be submitted to the Field Trial Secretary prior to the Closing Date. The club will be unable to accept, cancel or alter any entry after the closing date. **Post-dated cheques will not be accepted.** Please make cheques payable to **Eastern Slopes Spaniel Association.** We would encourage all entrants to enter using the www.dogshow.ca website. Most of the dog and handler information have been entered into the website but you should check your information. There is no charge to be a part of the website.

Attention Foreign Exhibitors: Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in U.S. funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian

Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds or use the www.dogshow.ca website.

****NEW** Temporary Competition Number ("TCN"):** The current system of entering events with "listed dogs" is being replaced with TCNs, which will be required to enter all events with closing dates after March 2, 2020. A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry and the same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until it is permanently registered with either a CKC number or an ERN.

To obtain a TCN:

First check the dog's profile on CKC to determine if CKC has already created a TCN for it. If not:

- 1) Go to the CKC web site, click on forms, under Shows and Trials click Exhibitors. Find the Temporary-Competition-Number-Application Form. Complete the application form on line and the TCN should be issued instantly; **or**
- 2) You may print the application form and submit it to CKC via mail; **or:**
- 3) You may contact Shows and Trials Division by telephone (1-855-364-7252) toll free or email information@ckc.ca.

There is no fee to obtain a TCN, however Exhibitors will still be required to pay TCN fees (formerly called listing fees) when entering events using this number. The current TCN fee is \$10.50 per trial. (ie. per dog per day)

Event Registration Number ("ERN"): All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned require an Event Registration Number (ERN) to enable them to be awarded titles by the CKC. A TCN will allow dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an ERN. Application forms may be obtained from the Field Trial Secretary.

Amateur All-Age Stake: “An Amateur All-Age Stake at a Spaniel Field Trial shall be for all dogs at least six months of age on the day of the trial at which the stake is judged. A person shall be considered an amateur if he has not attempted to receive any part of his livelihood from the training, handling or showing of field trial or hunting dogs in the calendar year of the trial or the preceding calendar year. Dogs running an Amateur Stake must be owned by an amateur and handled by an amateur.” *CKC Sporting Spaniel Field Trial Rules & Regulations, Chapter 10, Section 6*

Open All-Age Stake: “An Open All-Age Stake at a Spaniel Field Trial shall be for all dogs at least six months of age on the day of the trial at which the stake is judged.” *CKC Sporting Spaniel Field Trial Rules & Regulations, Chapter 10, Section 4*

Puppy Stake: “A Puppy Stake at a Spaniel Field Trial shall be for dogs at least 6 months of age and under 2 years of age on the day of the trial at which the Puppy Stake is judged.” *CKC Sporting Spaniel Field Trial Rules & Regulations, Chapter 10, Section 2*

Water Test: “A Spaniel is primarily a land dog. However, in many parts of the country he is used to retrieve waterfowl, and in an ordinary day’s shoot there are occasions when the only way of gathering shot game is after a swim or from a stream, pond or lake.” *CKC Sporting Spaniel Field Trial Rules & Regulations, Chapter 16, Section 1*

Points: Championship Points are awarded for placements in the All-Age Stakes, provided that there are 12 or more starters: 1st Place - 5 Points, 2nd Place - 3 Points, 3rd Place - 2 Points, 4th Place - 1 Point

Indignities: “It shall be the duty and obligation of the trial-giving club to see that a judge, club official, field trial marshal, volunteer, or competitor at a field trial held under these regulations, is not subject to indignities of any kind. The Field Trial Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred.” *CKC Sporting Spaniel Field Trial Rules & Regulations, Chapter 21, Section 7*

At the discretion of the judges and field trial committee there may be a water series on September 19, 2020. If held, the water series will be part of the field trial. Dogs not in the trial can enter the stand alone test in which case there is a \$10.00 fee and one retrieve involved.

NOTES

Please ensure all rabies shots are up to date.

Puppy stakes will be held each day between the 2nd and 3rd series of the Open and Amateur All-Age stakes.

In accordance with the CKC Spaniel Field Trial Rules and Regulations an article of **BLAZE ORANGE** clearly visible above the waist, must be worn by all persons in the field. **NO EXCEPTIONS**. Please note that the club has instituted a new rule that both a blaze orange hat & vest must be worn by everyone when they are on the field. This will be strictly enforced by the **Blaze Orange Police**.

Please bring your own lunch and refreshments as no lunches or refreshments will be provided.

ESSA has a prohibition against smoking anywhere on the property including the parking area, please NO SMOKING.

The CPR Reservoir Conservation Site is fenced so parking is limited. Please no trailers to be parked at the parking area

Noncompeting dogs must not be on the grounds (except in the parking area) and should be leashed when not kenneled.

Consumption of alcoholic beverages is not permitted on the field trial grounds except in the parking area. **DO NOT LITTER**. Your assistance in keeping the grounds clean will help ensure that we will be allowed to use them another time.



HEALTH AND SAFETY PROTOCOLS

In the unlikely event that you have been locked in a dark dungeon away from the entire world and have not heard about SARS-CoV-2 and the resulting illness COVID-19, we would like to inform you that the Eastern Slopes Spaniel Association will be following all Alberta CMOH Orders, guidance and protocols during the September 19 & 20, 2020 Spaniel field trials.

This includes the following:

This event is **restricted to 200 people** in attendance as per Alberta Stage 2 Gathering restrictions.

Please maintain physical distancing. Keep at least 2 meters between you and others. As we are outside, please be mindful of wind strength and direction.

- We will be allowing a gallery but please be mindful of the 2 meter physical distance.
- **Handlers will be required to carry their own birds.** (No Shaggers)
- **Judges may send dogs on voice** or some other method in lieu of tapping to maintain physical distancing.
- Participants/handlers to stay single file coming to the line with at least 2 meters physical distance.
- Wear a mask where physical distancing is not possible.
- Awards ceremony - placements to be broadcast via radio.
- Please bring your own hand sanitizer, etc.

DO NOT ATTEND AND SELF-ISOLATE IMMEDIATELY IF YOU:

- **Have a fever, cough, sore throat, runny nose, or shortness of breath;**
- **Have travelled outside of Canada within the last 14 days; or**
- **Are a close contact of a person who tested positive for COVID-19.**

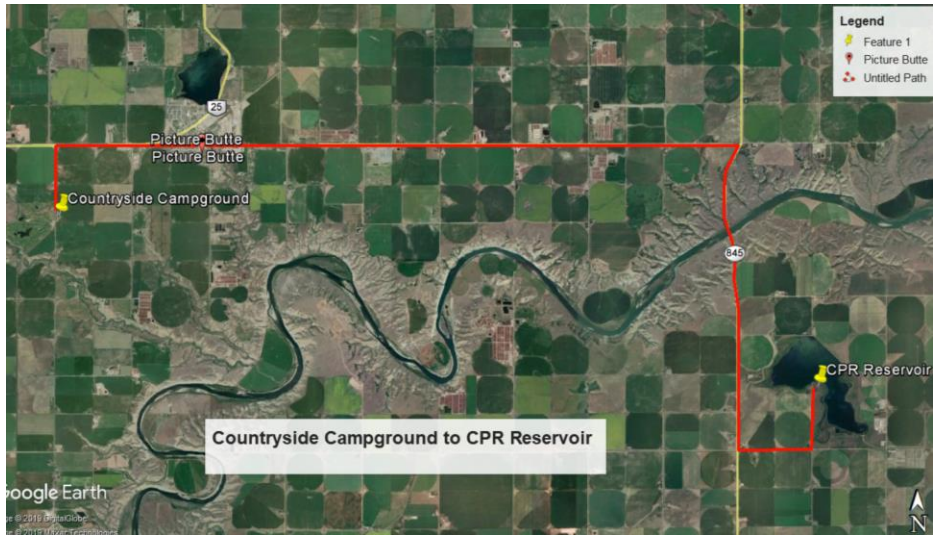
Directions: From Coaldale take Highway 845 north for approximately 9.6 km to Township Road 102. Turn East on Township Road 102 for 1.6 km to Range Road 201. Turn North on Range Road 201 and travel 1.6 km to parking area at north end of road.

Coaldale is the closest town and is approximately 9 kms from the grounds. It has a limited selection of accommodation but does have a 17 room motel – Coaldale Inn located at 913 19A Avenue in Coaldale, AB (Website: <http://www.coaldaleinn.com/> Phone: 403-345-5410; Email: info@coaldaleinn.com). Lethbridge is a small city with numerous hotels and restaurants and is approximately 23 kms from the grounds. There is no camping on the CPR Reservoir Conservation lands however there is a campground nearby at Picture Butte. It is a popular local campground that is located adjacent to a 27 hole golf course. It is 26 km from the grounds.

To get to the grounds from Countryside Campground travel north on Range Road 215 for 1.6 km to Highway 25, turn east and travel 2.4 km and turn right onto Rogers Ave. South in Picture Butte. Travel 12 km east to Highway 845. Turn south on Highway 845 for 6.4 km to Township Road 102. Turn east on Township Road 102 for 1.6 km to Range Road 201. Turn north on Range Road 201 and travel 1.6 km to parking area at north end of road.
