



## Judge Biographies

### DR. FRANCISCO CHAPA



Dr. Chapa was for many years a professional handler during which time he Championed breeds in all groups, and winning Best in Show on numerous occasions. As a breeder and exhibitor of Whippets he has been very successful having won Best in Show on forty-five occasions! He has been instrumental in the formation of six Kennel Clubs in Mexico. Veterinarian, owner, breeder, and handler since 1968 of German Shepherds, Borzoi, Boxer, Afghan Hound, American Cocker Spaniel, Shih Tzu and Whippets. He produced Mexican, International, De Las Americas and World champions. He has been a member of the Mexican Kennel club since 1970 and started with Judges exams in 1974, approved in 1989 all-breeds, international FCI Judge. He has judged in many countries: Australia, Argentina, Canada, Chili, Colombia, Costa Rica, Ecuador, United States, El Salvador, Guatemala, Hong Kong, India, Mexico, New Zealand, Paraguay, Peru, Puerto Rico, Uruguay, South Africa, Japan, Russia, Taiwan, Spain, and Venezuela. He has judged many "Top Dog" Shows such as World Dog Show, Show of Shows in Canada three times, Japan international Dog Shows, Sydney Australia 2000 Olympic shows, etc. He has judged specialty and National specialty shows for Boxer, Welsh Corgi Pembroke, Welsh Corgi Cardigan, Alaskan Malamute, Dalmatian, Maltese, English Setter, Irish Setter, Gordon Setter, English Cocker Spaniel, American Cocker Spaniel, Old English Sheepdog, Pekingese, Jack Russell, Great Pyrenees, Great Dane, German Shepherd, Doberman, Pointer, German Pointer, Chihuahua Smooth, Chihuahua Long Hair, Whippets, Afghan Hound, Miniature Schnauzer, Standard Schnauzer, Giant Schnauzer, Shih Tzu, Lhasa Apso, Borzoi, Xoloitzcuintli, Chinese Crested, Bull Terrier min, Chihuahuas, Salukies, Fox Terrier, Barbet, Norwich Terrier, & Shetland Shepard.

### JACQUELYN D FUSSEL



Jacquelyn D Fussell of Red Deer, AB has been involved in purebred dogs since the early age of 9 when her parents acquired their first purebred Doberman Pincher. She was also involved in 4-H showing and handling of Quarter horses. At that time there was always a purebred dog of either Siberian Husky Breed or Doberman Pincher Breed on hand helping out with these 4-H endeavours. After College, with a degree in interior decorating and another degree in interior design, once again purebred dogs became a priority. Jacqui opened up a grooming shop in the 1980's under the name Fine & Dandie Grooming Station. She also had a short adventure in Toy Poodles, Afghan Hounds, Borzoi, and Coonhounds, and showing various breeds in both Canada and the US. While exhibiting breeds in conformation the IWS soon took priority. Jacqui found herself breeding and showing the Irish Water Spaniel under the prefix Finnibone Reg;. Jacqui has honoured the Irish Water Spaniels for over 35 years by exhibiting them many times to #1 IWS, multiple wins at the US specialties, multiple champions, top producers, group winners, obtaining multiple BIS wins, as well as being honoured with a US Eukanuba Bred By Exhibitor Group Placement, and invitations to both Crufts and Westminster.

Jacquelyn is currently working on her Sporting Dog Permit in Canada.

\*TCN – Temporary Competition Number MUST be obtained from the CKC prior to entering any CKC event. TCNs will replace the previous system of entering events with dogs as “listed” and will allow dogs to temporarily participate in CKC events while they pursue permanent registration or an Event Registration Number (ERN). A TCN, MCN, ERN or CKC registration number is required for Baby puppies to enter, however the TCN entry fee is NOT paid on a baby puppy entry.

*Should you wish to withdraw your entry between the time that you enter and the close of entries you will receive a full refund of entry fees (any Credit Card, Apple Pay, Interac or e-transfer service charges WILL NOT be refunded as per dogshow.ca policy.)* Each day is a separate show and the above fees apply per day, per show except as noted. (These fees include CKC recording fees + 5% G.S.T.)

## Rules and Regulations

### GENERAL INFORMATION AND REGULATIONS

Dogs should be in the building at least one hour prior to ring time. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be aware of the posted schedule and be at ringside at the time of judging. The club will not call individual dogs to ringside. Please remain at ringside until judging is completed. A practice ring will be set up in the benching area. Regular rings must not be used for this purpose. Dogs must be exercised in the areas provided, anyone exercising their dogs on the grounds outside the building and not cleaning up after them, will be excluded from the show or trial.

Exhibitors are reminded to respect hospitality facilities. The Club reserves the right to refuse future entries from any exhibitor who creates excessive destructive or disruption to host facilities (Hotel, motel or campground). The show superintendent is in complete charge of the shows and trials which, are governed by CKC rules. No judge or any other person participating in any capacity at a dog show held under CKC rules shall be subjected to an indignity of any kind during the progress of the show. The Show Committee has a responsibility to see that this rule is enforced. Chapter 19.7, Page 55, CKC Conformation Show Rules and Regulations.

The Dog Show Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs, exhibitors and spectators, but will not be responsible for, nor assume any liability in the event of accident or misfortune. The Club and the specialty club reserves the right to remove from the shows or trials any person or dog for any just cause. Any dog excused by the show superintendent or veterinarian, for any reason, shall not compete in any classes or accept any awards for the duration of the shows or trials. No refund of any fees will be made.

If because of riot, civil disturbance, or any other acts beyond the control of the show committee, it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refunds shall be made!

### EXTRACTS FROM THE DOG SHOW RULES - BREEDS, CLASSES, AWARDS AND STAKES

**It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be familiar with the conformation, Obedience and Rally Rules set out by the Canadian Kennel Club.**

### CONFORMATION CLASSES OFFERED:

12.2.1 Regular official classes at a CKC conformation show shall be as described in (a) to (k) of this section. All classes must be divided by sex (except for Specials Only). Only dogs entered in one of the regular, non-regular, or unofficial classes shall be allowed within the show precincts.

**JUNIOR PUPPY:** shall be for dogs at least six months of age and under nine months of age on the day of the show.

**SENIOR PUPPY:** shall be for dogs 9 months of age and under twelve (12) months of age on the day of the show.

**12-18 MONTH -** for dogs over 12 months of age but under 18 months of age. (Divided by age: 12-15 months, 15-18 months)

**CANADIAN BRED:** shall be for dogs born in Canada, Champions of any country excluded

**BRED BY EXHIBITOR:** shall be for dogs owned and handled in the ring by the Breeder. The handler must be the owner/co-owner AND breeder/co-breeder of the dog. The owner/breeder must handle the dog in this class but need not handle the dog for further awards.

**OPEN CLASS:** shall be for all dogs.

**VETERAN** Dogs must be 7 years of age and over on the day of the show. Dogs entered in this class may be spayed or neutered. This class at a specialty MAY be divided by age. The winners of all of the Veteran's classes will come back into the ring to compete for Best of Breed. (Divided by age: 7-10Y – Veteran 10-12Y-Veteran 12+Y).

**SPECIALS ONLY:** is for dogs which have a recorded CKC Registration or Event Registration Number and have attained the required points for Championship status including at least one 2 point win either at the breed or group level. Should a dog which is entered in this class be found either not to be registered or has not completed the requirements for Championship status, all awards earned at the show will be cancelled. Dogs entered in this class will compete for Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex and Best Puppy if eligible.

### UNOFFICIAL/NON-REGULAR CLASSES OFFERED

**(with the exception of Baby Puppy all entries in these classes MUST be entered in a regular Class or as Exhibition Only)**

**BABY PUPPY** Dogs 4 months of age and under 6 months of age on the day of the show. The award for this class are: Best Baby Male and Best Baby Female Best Baby Puppy in Breed Best Baby Puppy in Group Best Baby Puppy in Show

**BRACE** At an all-breed or specialty show a club may, but is not required to, offer a Brace Class. This class shall be for 2 dogs of the same breed (not necessarily of the same sex). A Brace should be judged as an identical pair – same colour, size, gait, and same stride. When viewed from the side they should appear as one dog and its shadow. A brace must be handled by 1 person on 1 lead.

**STUD DOG** Stud dog and 2 or more of his get, not necessarily owned by the same owner. Get **MUST** be entered in a Regular Class.

**BROOD BITCH** Brood Bitch and two or more of her progeny, not necessarily owned by the same owner. Progeny **MUST** be entered in a Regular Class

**ALTERED:** Eligibility for the Sexually Altered Dog Classes shall be limited to dogs over 6 months of age which have been sexually altered by veterinary procedure. Points **MAY NOT** be carried from the regular competition judging to the Altered Dog Class judging. These classes will be judged immediately after Best of Breed of the regular classes. Two classes will be offered: **Altered Male & Altered Female**. Classes will be placed first through fourth in both sexes, the first place winner from each class will be declared Winners and the second place winner will be declared Reserve Winners. The Altered Winners Male and the Altered Winners Female will then compete for Best of Breed Altered and Best of Opposite Sex Altered in breed.

**Attention Foreign Exhibitors:** Please note that fees are due and payable in Canadian dollars. Due to consistently fluctuating currency rates, discounted cheques will not be accepted. Personal cheques will be accepted, however, they are to be payable in Canadian funds. If you send a cheque in US funds, it must be made out for the full amount of the entry and no exchange will be refunded to the exhibitor. Please do not mark cheques "Payable in Canadian Funds" or "At Par". They will not be cleared by the banks. To simplify the process, we urge that you pay by credit card, bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated.

**Entries sent by Courier must be sent prepaid;** To comply with instructions issued by the Canadian Kennel Club, we will be unable to accept any entry reaching our Show Secretary after the closing time and date.

Entries sent requiring a signature **WILL NOT BE** accepted.

**Please allow ample time for delays in the mail.**

**Exhibitors Please Note:** An exhibitor has the right to withdraw an entry at any time up to the closing date and time as published in the premium list. This may be done by telephone but **written or electronic notification must be received by the show secretary not later than closing date and time**. If written or electronic notification is not received, the dog will remain entered in the show.

*Section 9.9 Effective January 1, 2024*

The CKC will not consider a request for any corrections to results if received more than 90 days following the date(s) of the event(s).

#### **Section 19.7**

19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the CKC shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue.

**There will be no refunds after close of entries on duplicate entries or overpayments.**

**PEE WEE CLASS-**THIS CLASS IS FOR HANDLERS 4 YEARS OF AGE ON THE DATE OF THE COMPETITION UP TO THE DATE OF THEIR 7TH BIRTHDAY. THIS CLASS IS OPTIONAL AND NON-COMPETITIVE. NO PLACEMENTS ARE TO BE AWARDED; ONLY PARTICIPANT RIBBONS, ROSETTES AND TOKEN TROPHIES MAY BE PRESENTED.

**JUNIOR NOVICE CLASS-** THIS CLASS IS FOR HANDLERS 7 YEARS OF AGE ON THE DATE OF THE COMPETITION UP TO THE DATE OF THEIR 11TH BIRTHDAY WHO HAVE NOT WON 6 FIRST PLACES IN THE SAME CLASS WITH COMPETITION.

**JUNIOR OPEN CLASS-**THIS CLASS IS FOR HANDLERS 7 YEARS OF AGE ON THE DATE OF THE COMPETITION UP TO THE

DATE OF THEIR 11TH BIRTHDAY WHO HAVE NOT WON 6 FIRST PLACES WITH COMPETITION.

**INTERMEDIATE NOVICE CLASS-** THIS CLASS IS FOR HANDLERS 11 YEARS OF AGE ON THE DATE OF THE COMPETITION UP TO THE DATE OF THEIR 15TH BIRTHDAY WHO HAVE NOT WON 6 FIRST PLACES IN THE SAME CLASS WITH COMPETITION.

**INTERMEDIATE OPEN CLASS-** THIS CLASS IS FOR HANDLERS 11 YEARS OF AGE ON THE DATE OF THE COMPETITION UP TO THE DATE OF THEIR 15TH BIRTHDAY WHO HAVE NOT WON 6 FIRST PLACES WITH COMPETITION AND FOR ANY HANDLER WHO HAS PROGRESSED THROUGH THE JUNIOR OPEN LEVEL AND FEELS THAT HE HAS ENOUGH EXPERIENCE TO COMPETE AT THIS LEVEL.

**SENIOR NOVICE CLASS-** THIS CLASS IS FOR HANDLERS 15 YEARS OF AGE ON THE DATE OF THE COMPETITION UP TO THE DATE OF THEIR 18TH BIRTHDAY WHO HAVE NOT WON 6 FIRST PLACES WITH COMPETITION IN THIS CLASS. HANDLERS FROM THE INTERMEDIATE LEVELS PROGRESS TO THIS CLASS.

**SENIOR OPEN CLASS-** THIS CLASS IS FOR HANDLERS 15 YEARS OF AGE ON THE DATE OF THE COMPETITION UP TO THE DATE OF THEIR 18TH BIRTHDAY WHO HAVE NOT WON 6 FIRST PLACES WITH COMPETITION IN THE SENIOR NOVICE CLASS, AND FOR ANY HANDLER WHO HAS PROGRESSED THROUGH THE INTERMEDIATE OPEN LEVEL AND FEELS THAT HE HAS ENOUGH EXPERIENCE TO COMPETE AT THIS LEVEL

METHOD OF MOVING BETWEEN CLASSES SHALL BE AS FOLLOWS: IF A HANDLER ACHIEVES 6 FIRST PLACE WINS WITH COMPETITION, HE MUST MOVE TO THE OPEN CLASS WITHIN HIS AGE GROUP. POINTS ARE TO BE CARRIED FORWARD FROM ONE LEVEL TO THE NEXT.

**Extracts From CKC Dog Show Rules**

**Chapter 8 Entries and End of Show Section**

**8.2.5** An error in an age specified class, date of birth or sex may be amended on the entry form up to one hour before the start of the show.

**Section 8.3.1** Entries: Every dog entered in a Championship show must be one of the following:

- a) registered with the CKC,
- b) have an Event Registration Number,
- c) be eligible for registration with the CKC, or
- d) if it belongs to a listed breed, it must have a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN).

**Section 8.4.1** Listed Dogs: If a dog is not registered as in 8.3.1 (a) or (b) but is eligible for registration with the CKC, it may be entered at a show as a listed dog provided:

- b) that if born in Canada, it is eligible for individual registration;
- c) that if not born in Canada, is eligible for registration in the records of the CKC.
- d) that if it is a foreign born and owned dog, an Event Registration Number or CKC registration number is obtain from the CKC within 30 days of the first show entered.

**Section 8.4.2** Entry of a listed dog at a show must be accompanied by a listing fee as set by the Board in addition to the regular entry fee.

**Section 8.5.1** Acceptance of Entries: If indicated in the premium list, an electronically transmitted entry may be accepted provided the entry is accompanied by a credit card charge authorization.

**Section 8.5.3** No entry shall be accepted from or on behalf of any person who is officially known to be expelled, deprived of privileges, debarred or suspended by the CKC or any other registering body for pure bred dogs.

**Section 8.5.4** After entries close, no further entries may be accepted, cancelled or substituted other than as otherwise stated in this section or as provided for in case of a postal strike.

**Section 8.6.1** Refusal of Entries: The authorities of any show may:

- a) decline to accept entries for just cause, and/or
- b) refuse to receive or may remove any dog from the show building on account of disease or viciousness.
- c) in the case of non-acceptance, refund the fee with the reason for non-acceptance.

**Section 8.8.2** Fees: Tendering of a dishonoured cheque or declined credit card in payment of an entry fee shall be considered non-payment of said fee and is an offense punishable by disciplinary action and cancellation of awards.

**Section 8.9.1** Moving a Dog to Specials: A dog which is individually registered in the records of the CKC or that has a Miscellaneous Certification Number (MCN) and has completed the requirements for a Championship in accordance with these rules but at the time of the closing of entries for a show has not received confirmation of the title, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to Specials Only providing the transfer is submitted to the Show Secretary in writing by the owner or handler at least one hour prior to the opening of the show.

**Section 8.9.2** If it is established that a dog transferred to Specials Only has not completed the Championship requirements, all awards will be canceled and all ribbons and prizes won shall be forfeited. The owner may also be subject to disciplinary action.

**Section 8.9.3** When one or more All-Breed and/or Specialty Shows are held on the same day, in the same venue, the moving of class dogs to Specials must be made prior to the scheduled opening of the first show.

**Chapter 4 Judges Section 4.1.3** A judge officiating at a show held under these rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the progress of the show. It shall be the duty and obligation of the club holding the show to see that this rule is effectively carried out.

**Section 4.1.5** No person may approach a judge either directly or otherwise, orally or in writing, to favor his entry. Disciplinary action will be taken against any person who violates this rule or against a judge who fails to report any contravention of this rule to the CKC within 14 days of the act.

**Chapter 14 Disqualifying or Excusing Dogs**

**Section 14.1.2** (a) At his discretion, a judge shall have the authority to excuse or disqualify a dog which menaces, threatens, attempts to bite or bites the judge, another person, or another dog in the ring. When a dog is twice excused on this account, it shall have the status of a disqualified dog.

(b) At his discretion, a judge shall have the authority to permanently disqualify a dog which bites the judge or another person in the ring. Dogs disqualified under this provision will not be eligible for reinstatement. The decision to permanently disqualify a dog must be clearly indicated on the Judge's Disqualification Form.

**Section 14.1.4** Once a dog has been disqualified for any reason at a conformation show, it may not be entered or shown at another show until

the dog has been reinstated by the CKC. All awards earned by a dog shown in violation of this section will be cancelled by the CKC and the owner of the dog is subject to disciplinary action. A dog disqualified under section 14.1.2 (b) is not eligible for reinstatement.

**Section 14.1.5** Any dog that is disqualified under section 14.1.2(a) shall automatically be disqualified from entering in any CKC event in any other discipline until such time as the dog is officially reinstated, if the dog is eligible for reinstatement.

**Championship Points and Cancellations**

**Section 15.1.1** A dog awarded Winners at a conformation show shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the number of championship points credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be as provided hereunder.

**Section 15.1.2** The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points awarded Winners shall be as follows:

Dogs competing*	1	2	3-5	6-9	10-12	13 & more
Points allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

*\*Includes the dog awarded Winners.*

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall NOT be included in the calculation for championship points.

**Section 15.1.3** If a Dog awarded Winners was also awarded Best of Breed then at the show all dogs competing in the breed, including Specials Only, shall be included the total.

**Section 15.1.4** If a Dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed, then all dogs of the same sex including those competing for Specials Only shall be included in the total.

**Section 15.1.5** If a Dog awarded Winners is also awarded Best of Winners, then all dogs defeated directly or indirectly in the breed shall be included in the total.

**Section 15.1.6** If a dog is awarded Winners only, then all the dogs of the same sex in the class competition shall be included in the total.

**Section 15.1.7** The number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded Winners shall be determined by the highest award earned and calculated as per this section.

**Clarification:** Example of directly or indirectly defeating: If the Winners Bitch is awarded Best of Opposite Sex but not Best of Winners, the Best of Winners Male shall be deemed to have indirectly defeated the Specials Bitches, and is thus entitled to add them to the number of dogs and bitches defeated.

**Section 15.1.8** In addition to championship points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded Winners which also places in the regular Group competition shall be credited with the following additional points provided that the dog was defeated at the Group level.

**Section 15.1.9** A dog may not be credited with more than 5 championship points in a single show:

**Section 15.1.10** A breed or class shall not be allowed more than 2 sets of championship points per sex on any day in the same venue.

**Section 15.1.11** A dog awarded Winners which also places Best in Show at an all-breed conformation show shall be credited with 5 championship points inclusive of any points earned at the breed and group level.

**Section 15.1.12** In order for a dog to be recognized as a Champion and its owner provided with a Championship certificate, the dog must:

- (a) earn at least 10 championship points under at least 3 judges; and,
- (b) be individually registered in the records of the CKC or have an Event Registration Number.
- (c) have earned at least one 2 point win either at the breed or group level.

**15.2 Grand Champion (GCh)**

15.2.1 The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship.

15.2.2 Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship.

15.2.3 To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

**(a) Grand Champion Point System**

Points towards the Grand Champion title, are attained at breed level and are awarded to Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level for all levels of GCh:

(b) the following schedule shall be employed in determination of points awarded at Group Level for all GCh:

c) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age.

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.

(d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained.

Win	Points
Best in Show	5
Best of Breed at a National Specialty Show	5
Reserve Best in Show	4
Best of Breed at a Specialty Show (other than National)	3

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained.

(a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.

(b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

**15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx)**

15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

(a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed)

(b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins.

(c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

NOTE: 1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward to CKC upon completion of requirements above.

2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honoured up until July 1, 2022.
