***MOVING TO SPECIALS .. request to move up a dog to the Specials class must be made one hour prior to the BREED judging

EVENT REGISTRATION NUMBERS (ERN) Effective Jan 1992, all dogs who are foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events, no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an ERN. The ERN does not register a dog with the CKC for breeding purposes but rather enables a foreign owned dog to be awarded titles by the CKC. Each dog must have its own number. To obtain an ERN, mail or fax a copy of the dog's Foreign Registration Certificate, accompanied by the appropriate fee, to the CKC. Please provide your return address. An ERN must be applied for within 30 days of the first day of entering a CKC event.

JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP

This competition will be on SUNDAY JUNE 30 during the lunch break. Entry Fee is \$2.00 (includes \$1.00 to be donated to the Provincial Finals Fund), payable at registration between 10 and 11 am on Sunday. First to Fourth in each competitive class will receive a Rosette and the Best overall Handler will receive a Rosette and a prize. Dogs handled in the competition must be entered in the show on that day.

BOOTH SPACE

The price for the entire show weekend is \$85.00 for an 8 ft x 8 ft area which includes one table, if required, plus \$1.00 per square foot in excess of the 8 x 8 space. ELECTRICITY

Electricity is available at no charge inside the building for drying dogs. However, **PLEASE NOTE**: RVs need to be self contained as there are no outside outlets. There are also free dog-bathing facilities in the building and people showers.

BENCHING

All benching is free. Benching space is limited and will be on a first come first serve basis.

Exhibitors: please arrive early. The Club will not be responsible to find exhibitors space.

When making bookings we suggest that you confirm that they are still accepting dogs and whether they charge a fee for dogs. Please ensure your dogs are crated while in motel rooms. Leave rooms without evidence of dogs having stayed and pick up if you exercise the dogs outside. Your consideration will help to ensure the continued availability of the motels for our shows. **PLEASE BE TIDY!!**

GENERAL INFORMATION

On show days, the building will be opened at 6:30 am and will be closed at 10:30 pm.

The Show Committee will use due care and diligence for the welfare of dogs and exhibitors but will not assume responsibility nor liability associated with any accident, misfortune or loss to exhibitors, dogs or equipment. There will be <u>NO</u> overnight attendant in the building. Dogs left in the building overnight are left entirely at the owner's/handler's risk. The Show Superintendent will be in full charge of the show which will be governed by CKC rules.

It is the owner's/handler's responsibility to be at ringside ready for judging. Individual dogs will not be called. "In transit dogs" must be benched outside the building, as benching area is limited and must be saved for dogs entered in the show. No dog under the age of 6 months is allowed in the building at any time EXCEPT puppies over 4 months who are entered for Exhibition Only.

**Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs both inside and outside the building. Failure to do so may result in your being expelled from the building/show. A list of phone numbers for local vets will be posted at the Show Secretary's table. Any charges for vet services will be the responsibility of the person requesting the service.

Any judge officiating at a show held under CKC rules shall not be subjected to indignities of any kind during the show. There will be no smoking allowed in the building. Children must be kept under control at all times. Children allowed to run in the bleachers during the show may be asked to leave the building.

STATEMENT ON BULLYING

There will be a zero tolerance policy regarding bullying. Any individual utilizing bullying tactics at the show will be required t leave the premises immediately and for the remainder of the events. No refunds will be given in this case. A report will be filed with the CKC and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as lit deems fit.

What is bullying? The term bullying refers to treating individuals om a mean, insulting or abusive way, regardless if it is initiated deliberately or unconsciously. Bullying may cause the affected person to feel upset, afraid isolated or humiliated. Examples include but are not limited to:

- * insulting a persons skills, looks or habits
- * spreading false or malicious rumours, gossip, or innuendo
- * berating or belittling an individual
- * unwarranted criticizing or ridiculing, especially in the presence of others
- * using insulting nicknames
- * engaging in humiliating practical jokes
- * physical gestures that intimidate, offend, degrade or humiliate
- * mocking a person's accent abilities or mannerisms
- * yelling or shouting which intimidates, coerces or belittles

Exhibitors, handlers, judges and assistants are expected to participate with honesty, fairness, and integrity, ever mindful of "good sportsmanship" before, during and after this show. Any person engaging in an activity that might be considered malicious, threatening or constitutes bullying, including,

but not limited to, social media, will be asked to leave this show without compensation and will be banned from any future shows held by this club,

IMPORTANT** RULES IMPOSED BY CITY:

The city has imposed the following rules due to past years experience. These rules MUST be followed.

PARKING:

The city has designated the park lands adjacent to the arena for parking this year. There will be absolutely no parking allowed on the gravel areas around the arena nor on the grass along the road or on the North side of the arena. The lower parkland behind the arena has been designated for RV parking. RV parking will be for exhibitors Only. <u>No Spectator RV parking will be allowed.</u>

LIQUOR LAW:

There is to be no drinking of alcohol in public places. This includes inside the building.

DAMAGE:

Our Club will be held responsible for the cost of repairing any damage. Please ensure that you do not damage the parkland area when you park your RVs.

<u>LITTERING:</u> Our Club will have a large financial responsibility to the City if it is found that people have not cleaned up after their dogs. The City will be checking and any infractions will be charged to our Club. KINDLY EVERYONE...PICK UP AFTER YOUR DOGS!!!!!

CHAMPIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

A dog awarded winners at a championship show held under CKC rules shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the determination of the number of points to be credited to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be provided hereunder: The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points awarded to WINNERS shall be:

*DOGS COMPETING	1	2	3-5	6-9	10-12	13 or more
points allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5
*includes the dog awarded winners						

**In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall NOT be included in the calculation for championship points.

If a dog awarded WINNERS is also awarded Best of Breed at the show, then all dogs competing in the breed, including Specials Only, shall be included in the total.

If a dog awarded WINNERS is also awarded Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed, then all dogs of the same sex, including those competing for Specials Only, shall be included in the total.

If a dog awarded WINNERS is also awarded Best of Winners, then all dogs defeated directly or indirectly in the breed shall be included in the total. If a dog is awarded WINNERS only, then all the dogs of the same sex in the class competitions shall be included in the total.

In addition to championships points allocated at the breed level, a dog awarded WINNERS, who also places in the regular Group competition, shall be credited with the following additional points, provided that a dog was defeated at the Group level.

A dog may not be credited with more than 5 championship points in a single show.

GRAND CHAMPIONS: (GCh)

GCh title may be earned only after the completion of the CKC championship points do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship. To be awarded a GCh title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of 2 wins of at least 2 points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

GRAND CHAMPION POINT SYSTEM

Points toward the GCh title, at breed level, are awarded to Best of Breed, Best Opposite, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for Best of Breed winner and the number Of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best Opposite, Select Dog and Select Bitch) The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level:

BEST IN SHOW (5 points)

As of July 2021

- Grand Champion Bronze: Awarded after an additional 50 points are earned after completing a Grand Championship and other gualifiers.
- Grand Champion Silver: Awarded after an additional 100 points are earned after completing a Grand Championship Bronze and other qualifiers.
- Grand Champion Gold: Awarded after an additional 200 points are earned after completing a Grand Championship Silver and other qualifiers.

Competitors can begin to earn points for these new titles after July 1st, 2021. Have you already earned additional Grand Champion Points? Those can be used towards your Grand Champion Bronze title; however, you must earn a minimum of 5 points towards this title after July 1st, 2021.

CKC has improved the Grand Champion Excellent title.

• Grand Champion Excellence: awarded after achieving a Grand Champion Silver Title, a Best in Show or Best of Breed win at a National Specialty (minimum number of dogs required to be competing), 3 Group 1st's or 3 Best of Breed Specialty Wins, as well as a CKC Performance Title (excluding any instinct level titles, Sprinter, Chase Ability, Herding Novice or CGN).

With the new version of the Grand Champion Excellent title, no additional points are required to be counted. You can find more information on the upcoming changes in the July 1st, 2021 version of the Conformation Show Rules and Regulations.

Don't worry! For those currently working towards a Grand Champion Excellent title, the current qualifications will still be honored until July 1st, 2022 (this date is subject to review based on COVID-19 restrictions). The following form can still be used to track and submit your qualifications to CKC for review:

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points. (d) Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.4 Grand Champion Bronze (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained. (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship. (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward. (c) Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 Grand Champion Silver (GChS) The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained. (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Bronze is attained,

and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze. (05-06-20) (05-06-

15.2.6 Grand Champion Gold: (GChG) The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained. (a) Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Champion Silver is attained, and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver. (b) To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best In Show/ Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.3 Grand Champion Excellent (GChEx)

15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may be granted only after the completion of the CKC Grand Championship Silver Title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website.

15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special: (a) one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed national specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed) (b) three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty best of breed wins. (c) a CKC performance title from any CKC Event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

CKC RULE: An annual non-member participation fee for awards and titles will be charged to a Canadian non-member of CKC. The fee will match the ERN fee. In order to protect the awards/titles earned the non-member will have a choice either to become a CKC member or to pay the nonmember participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards and titles to be canceled. These fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by non CKC members and are not applicable to CKC members
